- **Teaching.** My primary teaching responsibilities include three undergraduate courses, FYC4210 Children–Trauma and Resiliency; FYC3115 Human Services; and FYC3005 Introduction to Personal and Family Financial Planning; and one graduate course, FYC6920 Capstone. I develop and revise curriculum as needed. I supervise independent studies for undergraduate and graduate students. I chair graduate student thesis and doctoral committees and serve as a member on internal and external graduate committees. I supervise graduate capstone students.
- **Research.** My research program focuses on family stability and explores the factors, processes, interventions, and policies that promote resilience, cohesion, and well-being within families. An important aspect of my research program is evaluating the effectiveness of child welfare policies, programs, and interventions in promoting positive outcomes for children and families. Ultimately, my research program aims to inform evidence-based policy and practice initiatives that strengthen families and build resilience. I publish in refereed journals, present research at conferences, obtain grant funding, and supervise student research.
- **Extension.** My Extension program areas are 1) trauma-informed care and 2) personal and family financial planning. I mentor Extension faculty by providing education and funding for their professional development; developing curriculum; conducting in-service trainings, workshops, webinars, and seminars; and writing blogs and EDIS publications.
- I contribute to the department, college, and university through membership and leadership on various committees while also maintaining leadership roles in the discipline's professional societies.
- I develop and cultivate international partnerships to enhance educational initiatives, community engagement, capacity building, and research collaborations.

### Description of primary courses

**Human Services (FYC3115):** In-depth look at human services that assist children and families, with focus on child welfare. Emphasizes professional development of helping skills for working directly with at risk children and families. My goal is to prepare students for careers in human services.

**Introduction to Personal and Family Financial Planning (FYC3005):** Examines the management of personal and family financial resources throughout the life span. A study of individual and family finances as related to planning, credit, saving, investment, insurance, taxes, housing costs, transportation costs, retirement, and estate planning. Students complete a series of personal financial planning projects in the areas of spending, budgeting, savings, credit, insurance, investments, and retirement planning. My goal is to increase students' financial literacy and positive financial behaviors.

**Children: Trauma and Resiliency (FYC4210/FYC4932):** Evolving research on the developing child and the neurobiology of trauma has dramatically changed our understanding of adverse childhood experiences and the impacts on the growing child. This research is accompanied by expanding knowledge of effective interventions. This course focuses on both areas: the nature of childhood trauma and trust-based relational intervention (TBRI). My goal is to prepare students for careers working with at-risk children and families.

**Capstone (FYC6920):** Students complete a final project addressing an issue within Family, Youth and Community Sciences, prepare an e-portfolio of academic and professional accomplishments, and deliver a professional presentation. The successful completion of these course assignments satisfies the graduate school requirement for a comprehensive examination for a master's degree without thesis.
